

SUPERVISION, POLICY & COMPETITION

Bring your passion for problem solving and strategic thinking into the constantly evolving world of financial regulation.


Supervision, Policy & Competition (SPC) oversees every business providing financial products and services in the UK. It's work is vital to protect customers and maintain the integrity of financial markets. SPC ensures that firms work ethically and to the highest standards. There are two routes within our SPC Graduate Programme:

1 / Generalist

On this route, you'll have the opportunity to move around and complete rotations across a variety of areas. You could be reviewing business models and analysing identified risks, developing and delivering new policy proposals or engaging with firms to ensure they put consumers at the heart of their business and respond appropriately when detriment arises.

2 / Specialist

This route is aimed at those with a STEM or Economics background. You'll work with firms across all sectors and develop a unique specialism within an area such as financial crime, cyber, safeguarding client assets, resolution or operational and financial resilience. You'll provide direction and support to front-line supervisors, helping to reduce consumer harm. You'll also go on an internal secondment to learn how other areas of the FCA operate. You could also undertake a professional qualification such as a Cyber degree, CFA, ACCA or a diploma in Financial Crime.



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AUTHORISATIONS

Authorisations is the FCA's supervisory gateway, we decide who can undertake regulated activities in the UK.

As the first point of contact for firms and individuals wanting to provide regulated financial services, Authorisations will:

- review new and innovative business models and the risks associated with these
- keep bad actors out of the markets
- support those who meet our standards

The work is challenging but varied. We'll support you through coaching on essential business skills, and your skills will develop through exposure to senior stakeholders and challenging projects. Authorisations alumni acquire skills and market knowledge that is highly sought after. Joining us is an excellent route to a successful FCA career.

As a gateway supervisor you'll make decisions on whether to approve applications from firms and individuals. You'll review applications spanning a range of sectors and financial models, and help us decide whether individuals are suitable to undertake senior manager roles, such as a CEO or Board Director.

You could spend time working in our Supervision Hub; a key part of the supervision system which offers a master class in managing customer relations and regulation. The Hub is a key tool for sourcing intelligence used across the FCA to strengthen regulation and protect consumers and market integrity. It's tough, but a great place to learn about the business.



ECONOMICS

Working in our Economics specialist programme you'll get the chance to use your skills in a unique way. Supporting the wider function of the FCA, you'll provide analysis and advice based on economic principles and techniques.

Our Economics team provide rigorous economic thinking, research, analysis and advice to help the FCA deliver on its strategic objective of making financial services markets work well. Day-to-day, you could be drafting reports, researching the background of a specified market, presenting on your analysis or providing support and economic analysis to the rest of the organisation. On top of all the experience you will gain throughout the programme, you'll also undertake a fully funded MSc in Economics, if you don t already have one.



There are lots of options for economists at the FCA. Whether you're interested in behavioural economics or policy evaluation, the graduate scheme gives you the opportunity to explore areas that interest you.

DATA, TECHNOLOGY & INNOVATION

In Data, Technology & Innovation, we are transforming the way the FCA analyses and uses the data, intelligence and information we receive, so we can spot harm and act sooner. This allows us to more effectively regulate the firms we oversee.

Within Data, Technology & Innovation there are two routes for graduates:

1 / Data Science

On this route you'll get the opportunity to rotate across the organisation, working with varied and unique data sets. You'll be part of a pioneering team and will champion disruptive and innovative solutions. You'll use data science techniques to solve challenging problems, improve FCA operations and advance our ability to identify harm. This will include deploying machine learning to build classifiers, implementing natural language processing to automate document analysis and using network analytics to identify transaction patterns.

- have proven analytical and problem-solving skills
- are a team player with strong interpersonal skills

2 / Tech & Change

On this route you'll support a large and varied portfolio of change programmes, implementing new regulatory directives and the required information technology services. You'll be aligned to one of our three Communities of Practice; Architecture and Operations, Change or Technology Delivery. You'll rotate across all three, but for your final rotation, you'll develop your skills within your chosen Community of Practice. Throughout the programme you'll gain exposure to a wide variety of business areas, delivering the solutions to complex business problems.

ENFORCEMENT

Our Enforcement teams investigate and penalise UK businesses for breaching financial regulations. They look into companies' misconduct and, ultimately, bring about criminal and civil prosecutions.

As a graduate in the Enforcement team, you'll be investigating and tackling the most serious regulatory breaches and incidents in financial services. Every day will be different and the work you do will be varied, challenging and interesting, whether you're studying relevant financial regulation and possible breaches or interviewing people to get a clearer picture of what has gone on. You'll gain a great understanding of our legal framework as you work on high-profile cases and make it clear to perpetrators and beyond that there are real consequences for those who don t meet our standards.

Our Enforcement programme can set you up for a career that has a real impact, as you develop your understanding of the market, the behaviours of consumer victims and the extent of the FCAs powers to take action where we see potential misconduct.

Working in Enforcement is a bit like being a detective, investigating breaches of financial regulation in the financial sector.
