
FINAL NOTICE

To: James Boyd Parker

TAKE NOTICE: The Financial Services Authority ("the FSA") of 25, The North Colonnade, Canary Wharf, London E14 5HS, gives you, James Boyd Parker, notice about a requirement to pay a financial penalty.

PENALTY

For the reasons set out below, the FSA imposes a financial penalty on you ("Mr Parker") of £250,000, pursuant to section 123 of the Financial Services and Markets Act 2000 ("the Act") (Power to impose penalties in cases of market abuse).

REASONS FOR THE PENALTY

In its judgment published on 18 August 2006, the Financial Services and Markets Tribunal concluded that:

- (a) Mr Parker engaged in market abuse from 27 February 2002 to 4 March 2002, by dealing in and spread betting on shares in Pace Micro Technology plc;
- (b) By doing so Mr Parker made an abusive profit of £121,742; and
- (c) The appropriate aggregate financial penalty which should be imposed on Mr Parker was £250,000.

The FSA is obliged to act in accordance with the Tribunal's determination and, accordingly, it imposes a financial penalty on Mr Parker of £250,000.

IMPORTANT NOTICES

This Final Notice is given to you under section 390 of the Act.

Manner and time for payment

The financial penalty must be paid in full by Mr Parker to the FSA by no later than 5pm on **Thursday 26 October 2006**, being not less than 14 days from the date of this Final Notice.

If the financial penalty is not paid

If all or any of the financial penalty is outstanding on **Friday 27 October 2006**, the FSA may recover the outstanding amount as a debt owed by Mr Parker and due to the FSA.

Publicity

Sections 391(4), 391(6) and 391(7) of the Act apply to the publication of information about the matter to which this Notice relates. Under those provisions, the FSA must publish such information about the matter to which this Notice relates as the FSA considers appropriate. The information may be published in such manner as the FSA considers appropriate. However, the FSA may not publish information if such publication would, in the opinion of the FSA, be unfair or prejudicial to the interests of consumers.

The FSA intends to publish such information about the matter to which this Final Notice relates as it considers appropriate.
