Freedom of Information: Right to know request

Thank you for your email of 11 June 2020, about firm submissions of EMIR Breach Notifications and MiFIR Transaction Reporting.

We are handling your email as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) and have answered each question in turn.

**European Market Infrastructure Regulation (EMIR)**

***1. Please can you let me know how many firms have submitted an 'EMIR Breach Notification form' to notify the FCA about any errors or omissions in their reports under Art. 9 of EMIR***

***(a) The total number of reports received from 3 January 2018 to 29 May 2020.***

We can confirm that between 3 January 2018 and 29 May 2020 the FCA received 400 notifications from firms regarding EMIR Art 9 reporting errors and omissions. Please note that this figure includes instances where the same firm has submitted notifications on more than one occasion.

**Markets in Financial Instruments Regulation (MiFIR)**

***(b) Additionally, please can you tell me how many firms have submitted a MiFIR Transaction Reporting 'Error and Omission form***

We can confirm in line with the requirement in Article 15(2) of Commission Delegated Regulation 2017/590 (RTS 22), 623 firms submitted at least one transaction reporting errors and omissions notification form between 3 January 2018 and 29 May 2020.

***(c) And the total number of reports received during the same period.***

Between 3 January 2018 to 29 May 2020, 15,823,659,156 transaction reports were accepted by the FCA's Market Data Processor (MDP).

***2. Please can you tell me how many MiFIR transaction reports received by the FCA have been corrections of previously submitted reports***

We do not hold this information as there is no field within a transaction report that indicates that a correction is being made.

***(a) And what percentage this represents of the overall number of transaction reports submitted to the FCA in the period from 3 January 2018 to 29 May 2020.***

We do not hold this information.
