# Freedom of Information : Right to know request

We refer to your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 ("the Act"), made on Tuesday 6th November 2018 regarding candidates for Approved Person roles for the period 2016, 2017 and 2018.

For full details of your request please refer to Annex A. (For ease of reference your request has been numbered).

We have now considered your request and we can confirm that we hold some information falling within scope. We do not hold information relevant to point 10.

With regard to the remainder points, the information we can disclose to you is set out in the table below.

Where the figure in each category is fewer than ten, we are unable to provide the information as to disclose this would lead to the identification of individuals and their personal data being disclosed. For this reason, we consider that section 40 (Personal Data) of the Act applies to this information. (Where this applies we have responded with "S40").

# <u>Annex B</u>

## • Section 40 (Personal Information)

To the extent that the information that we hold contains personal data about individuals, section 40(2)(b) of the Act provides that "[a]ny information to which a request for information relates is also exempt information if ... either the first or second condition below [see sections 40(3) and 40(4) of the Act] is satisfied".

We have applied this exemption because the first condition (as stated in section 40(3) of the Act) is satisfied. The information you have requested comprises the personal data of individuals other than yourself which, if disclosed, would breach the requirement of the General Data Protection Regulations ("GDPR") including the data protection principles of Article 5 and the Data Protection Act 2018 ("DPA").

In particular, it would be a breach of the first data protection Principle as set out in Article 5 of the GDPR, to disclose such information, as it would not be necessary or fair to the individuals concerned, or lawful, where none of the conditions in Article 6(1) of the GDPR have been met. The individuals concerned have not given their consent for their personal details to be made public and the release of such information may be detrimental to the individuals themselves.
