

Freedom of Information: Right to know request

We write further to our previous emails about your request for information relating to enforcement investigations. When we wrote to you, we advised that we needed additional time to consider your request as we considered that section 31 (law enforcement) may apply to some (or all) of the information and a decision had not yet been reached on the balance of public interest in respect of that information.

Having now thoroughly considered the information, we have concluded that this exemption does not apply and we are able to provide you with the information requested as outlined below. We have addressed each point in turn.

Please note that the data in respect of questions 1 and 2 include investigations into both firms and individuals.
