- a. were received
- b. were approved
- c. were rejected or withdrawn

For the answers to a), b) and c) please can you provide a breakdown of how many of the applications were from:

- a. A UK registered organisation
- b. A non-UK registered organisation
- 2. For each year from 2010 2021 inclusive, how many applications to become an electronic money institution in accordance with the Electronic Money Regulations 2011 (EMRs):
- a. were received
- b. were approved
- c. were rejected or withdrawn

For the answers to a), b) and c) please can you provide a breakdown of how many of the applications were from:

- a. A UK registered organisation
- b. A non-UK registered organisation'

We have processed your email in line with the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) and the requested data is attached in Annex A.

Please note that we have not broken down the data into UK or non-UK registered organisations, as this is not information that the FCA currently records for these types of applications.

It is a condition of authorisation and registration as a payment institution under the PSRs 2009 and PSRs 2017 for an applicant firm that is a body corporate to have its registered office in the UK.

There is a similar provision in place for electronic money institutions under the EMRs 2011, with an exception granted for branches of a company based in a 3rd country i.e. outside of the EEA.
